this fellow still doesn't seem to compromise on his play.

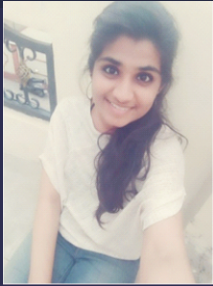
He transforms the wall into an abstract masterpiece

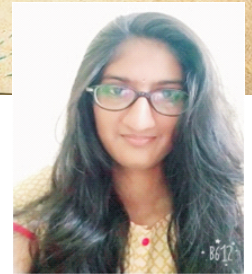

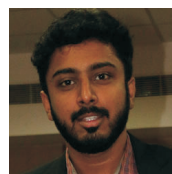

I am developing every aspect in my life to be a loyal and dexterous citizen of our country.

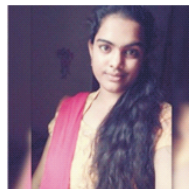

Books suggested by Mr. Bill Gates

In what's become an annual tradition, Bill Gates has named his favorite books of the year. And this year's diverse list features a graphic novel about the immigrant experience and a thorough exploration of the importance of energy in the development of civilization, among others.

Given the range of subjects on the Microsoft MSFT, -0.13% co-founder's list this year, the selections point to how curiosity drives Gates's reading habits. "Although I'm lucky that I get to meet with a lot of interesting people and visit fascinating places through my work, I still think books are the best way to explore new topics that interest you," the billionaire says.

Among the titles that attracted his attention but didn't make the top 5 were best-selling author John Green's latest tome, "Turtles All the Way Down," and "Black Flags: The Rise of ISIS," a look at the making of the terror organization. Here are the books that did make the cut:

"The Best We Could Do," by Thi Bui

In this autobiographical graphic novel, Bui explores her family's past and the challenges her parents, refugees who left Vietnam for America, faced raising four children. The novel covers both universal and foreign themes.

"I thought she did a great job capturing how daunting it feels to be responsible for your family," he says. "At the same time, her family's experience is different from most (and certainly mine). It's clear that a lot of the dysfunction surrounding her childhood is a direct result of what happened in Vietnam."

Gates said that this book and "The Sympathizer" (also among his favorite books of the year), helped him to understand the conflict in Southeast Asia beyond "the 'Good Morning, Vietnam' view of the war." "In different ways, 'The Best We Could Do' and 'The Sympathizer' are cautionary tales about the collateral damage of war," he says.

"Evicted: Poverty and Profit in the American City," by Matthew Desmond

Recipient of the 2017 Pulitzer Prize for General Nonfiction, this book examines the struggles of families living in some of the poorest parts of Milwaukee in the wake of the financial crisis. Desmond, a MacArthur genius grant recipient and a grantee of Gates's charitable foundation, spent 18 months living in two high-poverty neighborhoods while researching the book.

Though the book primarily deals with problems related to housing, Gates also valued its depiction of how issues related to poverty intertwine. The book provided the billionaire with "a better sense of what it is like to be very poor in this country" more than anything else he has read, he said.

"Believe Me: A Memoir of Love, Death, and Jazz Chickens," by Eddie Izzard

According to Gates, he and Izzard have a lot in common. They were both nerdy and awkward as kids, and both excel at math, dropped out of college and lost their mothers to cancer. But Gates says finding similarities with the comedian is "the overarching point of this book."

Though he counts Izzard among his favorite comedians, Gates acknowledges that not everyone may be a fan of the performer's material. Indeed, he goes so far as to caution people unfamiliar with Izzard's stand-up against reading the memoir. "You have to witness his brand of surreal, intellectual, self-deprecating humor," Gates says. "Otherwise, it will be like you're walking into the middle of a conversation."

People who do read the book won't just encounter a by-the-numbers description of Izzard's rise to fame. Gates believes that Izzard's life is a perfect case study of the concept of the "growth mindset," which suggests that success is determined by "practice and perseverance rather than DNA and destiny."

"The Sympathizer," by Viet Thanh Nguyen

Nguyen's work is both the second Pulitzer Prize-winner and the second tale related to the Vietnam War on Gates's list, and Nguyen is the second MacArthur Fellowship recipient to be featured this year. The novel is told through the flashbacks of an anonymous North Vietnamese spy who was initially embedded with the South Vietnamese Army and later airlifted out of Saigon and relocated in Los Angeles.

Though he characterizes it as a fast-paced read and entertaining, Gates also warns that the novel is "surprisingly bleak," given the immoral actions of the book's narrator.

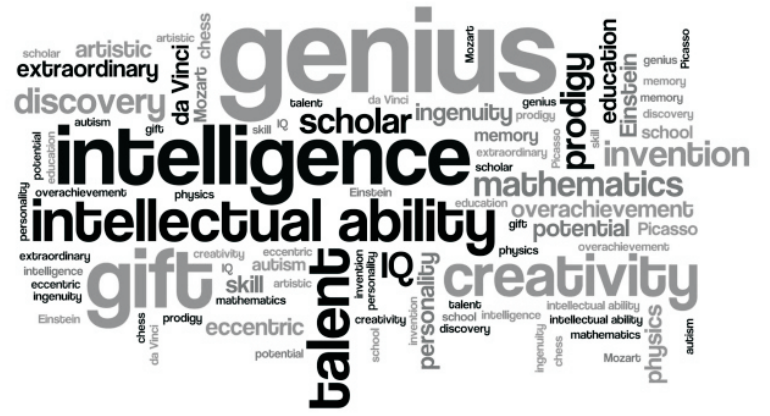
"Energy and Civilization: A History," by Vaclav Smil

According to Gates, he anticipates new works from this Czech-Canadian scholar "the way some people wait for the next 'Star Wars' movie." Smil's latest work argues that cultivating crops allowed humanity to explore more efficient ways of converting energy into food, which in turn paved the way for more complex societies to evolve.

"Yes, our history has a lot to do with kings and queens and games of thrones," Gates writes. "Smil shows that it has even more to do with energy innovation."

Though Gates recommends the book, he cautioned that he takes issue with Smil's view that the transition to clean energy might not be a smooth one. "I can't help but feel optimistic about what's on the horizon — from carbon-neutral liquid fuels to game-changing improvements in energy generation, storage, and transmission," he says.

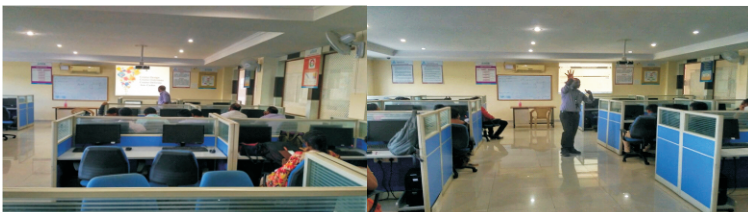

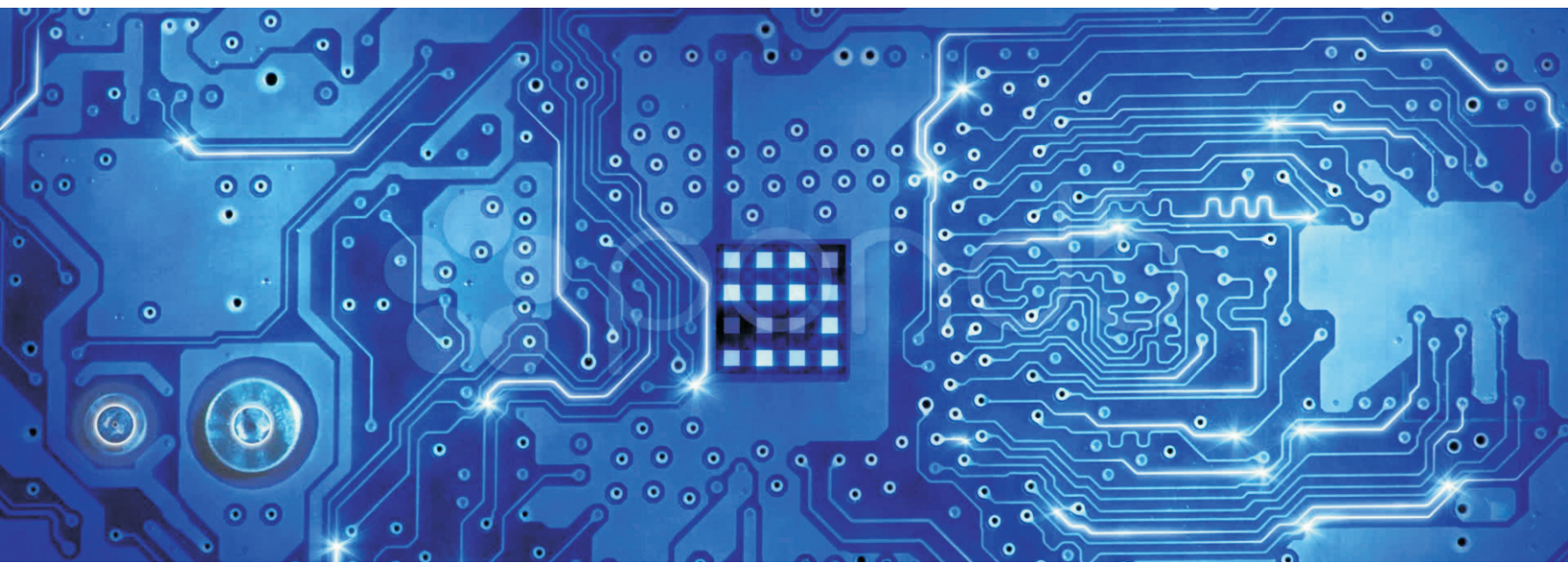
Guest Lecture on "Microwave Oscillators"

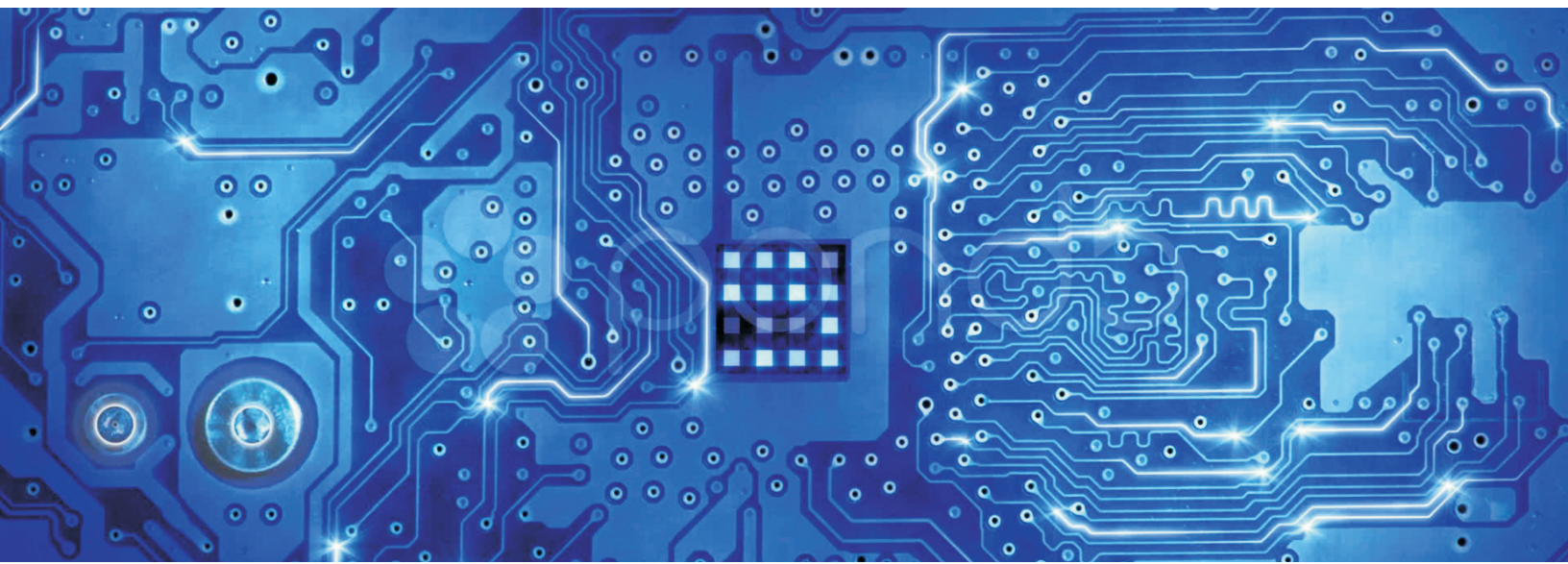

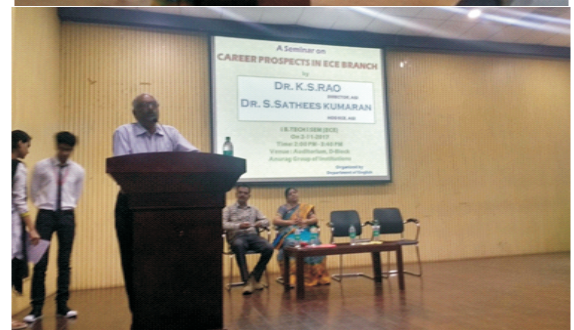

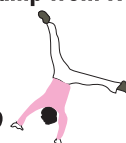
